Re: Semi-Open Primary Memo

Date: December 5, 2023

Effective January 1, 2024, Maine will be transitioning from a closed primary system to a **semi-open primary**. Unenrolled voters will now be able to participate in primaries including the March 5, 2024 Presidential Primary and the June 11, 2024 State Primary.

- 1. <u>Unenrolled Voters</u> Voters who are not enrolled in a party may choose to vote in <u>one</u> party's primary.
- 2. Voters enrolled in a party may only vote in that party's primary.

Each qualified party had until October 1, 2023 to file a certification with the Secretary of State to participate in the Presidential Primary. **The Democratic and Republican parties are the only parties that will hold primaries on March 5th.** The Green Independent and Libertarian parties will not be participating.

The chart below illustrates the ballot options for the Presidential Primary based on voter enrollment:

Voter Enrollment Status	Ballot Options
Unenrolled	May select either a Democratic or Republican ballot
Democratic	No ballot selection - must receive Democratic ballot
Green Independent	No ballot selection - Party not participating in Primary
Libertarian	No ballot selection - Party not participating in Primary
Republican	No ballot selection - must receive Republican ballot
No Labels (qualifying)	No ballot selection (qualifying party). If No Labels becomes "qualified" in January,
	the party will still not be participating in primary

The Absentee Ballot Requestion Application has been updated with the following changes to accommodate the new semi-open primary requirements:

- 1. An "Enrollment" box has been added to the upper right box.
- 2. A "Ballot requested" question (#5) has been added for unenrolled voters to select a primary ballot.

How to Process Absentee Ballot Requests for the Semi-Open Presidential Primary

- 1. Set up a hard copy "Unenrolled Absentee Request File"
- 2. Search the voter in CVR to verify that the voter is registered in your municipality.
- 3. If the voter is enrolled in a qualified or qualifying party, enter the party abbreviation in the new upper right "Enrollment" box on the application.
- 4. If the voter is unenrolled, enter a "U" in the new upper right "Enrollment" box on the application.
- 5. Enter all requests in CVR as usual, except for the party ballot selection, which is not available in the current CVR.
- 6. File all the requests from unenrolled voters into the "Unenrolled Absentee Request File" <u>Note:</u> This file will segregate the unenrolled voter applications, so that you can enter the party selection ballot once the new CVR is implemented. The new CVR will have a field for the ballot selection.

Reminder: Voters Enrolled in a Party

- Voters that are enrolled in a qualified party participating in the primary must be provided with that party ballot, even if the voter selects a different ballot on the absentee ballot request. Only unenrolled voters can participate in a party's primary without enrolling in the party.
- You will undoubtedly receive absentee applications from voters enrolled in a party that will try to select a different ballot in Question #5. Disregard the ballot selected in Question #5 and enter the voter's <u>current enrollment</u> in the "Enrollment" box. This will help prevent errors when ballots are provided to voters.
- Voters enrolled in a qualifying party (Forward, No Labels or People's) do not have an
 option to select a ballot. They must either enroll in a qualified party or become unenrolled
 to participate in the primary.
- Voters that change or withdraw their enrollment within 15 days of the election are ineligible to participate in the primary.

<u>Reminder:</u> A voter must remain in a party for 3 months before changing parties or unenrolling. They must do so at least 15 days before the primary in order to be eligible to vote in the primary.
